Since JSC-36.....

Two events in 2015 marked a paradigm shift in international politics:

- The adoption of the 17 universal Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) for people and the planet to be met in 2030.
- The Paris agreement (COP21) to rapidly decarbonize the global economy and to keep the global mean temperature of the Earth to well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels.

This calls for **new thinking** beyond environmentalism and beyond traditional economic thinking that redefine a **safe operating space** for humanity in an era where **climate stability cannot be longer assured**.

In this new era, what should be the **strategic directions** of WCRP?

Importance of **regional aspects**, smart use of the **International Green Fund** and assessments of climate consequences from actions to be taken.

European branch of the WCRP CORDEX initiative



Model domain

- Horizontal resolutions: 12.5 km and 50 km
- Scenarios:
 - RCP 4.5, RCP 8.5 (focus)
 - RCP 2.6 (so far: few simulations)

Community

- 29 actively contribution groups
- Leading institutions in the field of regional climate modeling in Europe
- Voluntary effort, contributions are funde by the contributors

62 scenario simulations at high resolution (EUR-11, 12.5 km): 16 planned, 4 running, 42 finished (31 simulations published)
