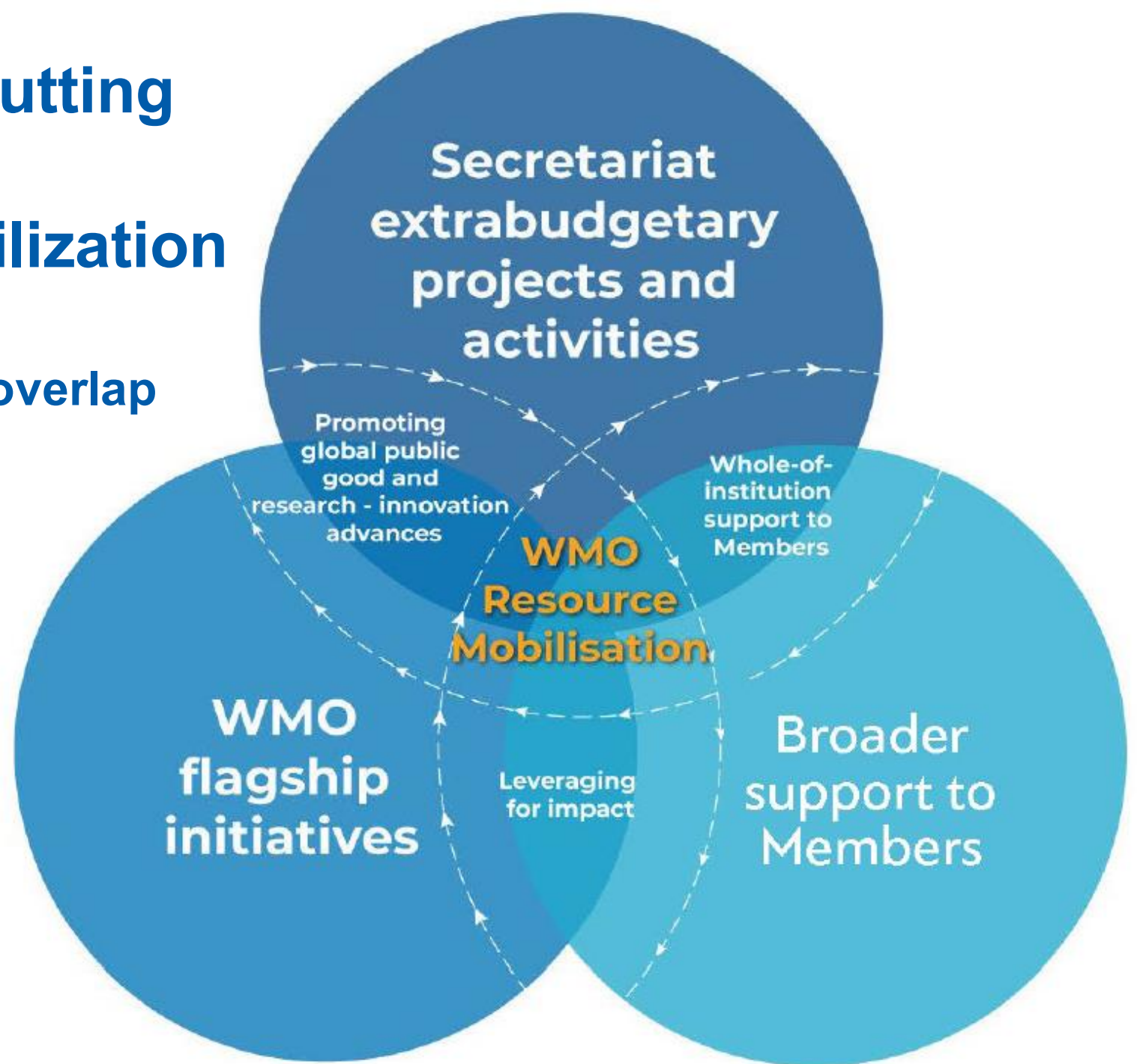

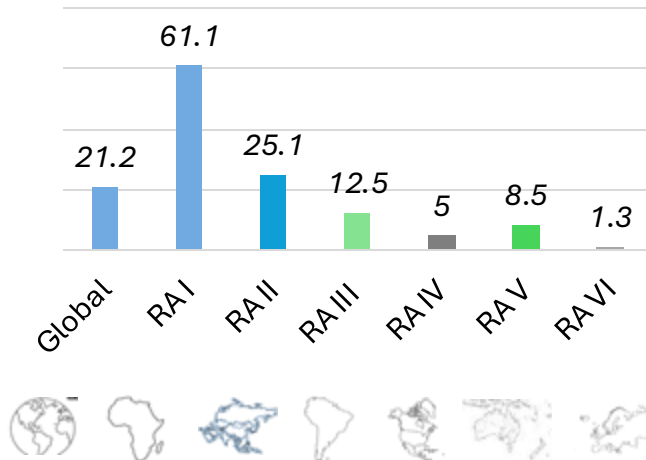

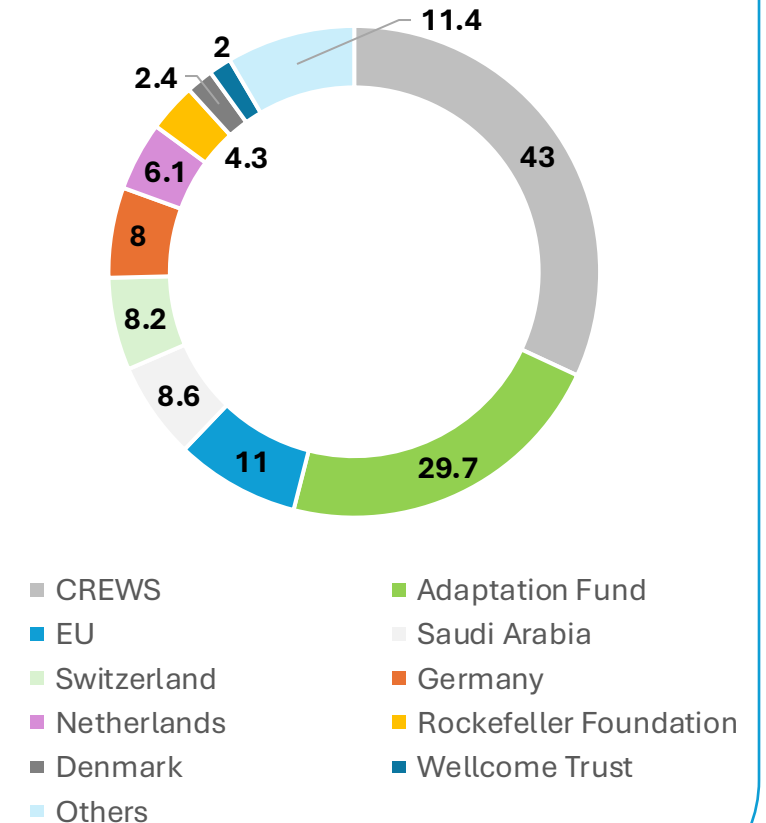

Development and Climate Funder Landscape

Funder	Research Funding	Specificity of Activities	Ease of Access
Climate Funds (GCF, AF, GEF, CIFs, CREWS)	Medium	Applied & programmatic	Accreditation required, mostly heavy admin
Bilateral donors (ODA)	Medium	Mixed	Medium process
Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs)	Small	Targeted	Unpredictable, generally difficult
Major Foundations	Large	Programmatic	Generally need relationship
Smaller Foundations	Medium	Targeted	Generally need relationship
High net worth individuals	Medium	Mixed	Need a hook
