



Congratulations: Prof. Sergey Gulev Elected Corresponding Member of the Russian Academy of Science

Professor Sergey Gulev, a former WCRP JSC Officer, a member of the SOLAS SSC and a current member of the CLIVAR SSG, has been elected a Corresponding Member of the Russian Academy of Sciences.

Sergey Gulev is the head of the Air-Sea Interaction and Climate Lab at the P.P. Shirshov Institute of Oceanology (SIO), Russian Academy of Sciences, and a Professor in Meteorology and Oceanography at the Moscow State University (MSU).

Sergey graduated from MSU in 1980 and got his PhD from State Oceanographic Institute in 1985 and his DSci degree from SIO in 1996. In 1992/93 he was a Humboldt Fellow at the Institute fuer Meereskunde in Kiel. He developed global and regional estimates of surface air-sea fluxes, climatologies of ocean wind waves and cyclone activity as well as ocean GCM – based diagnostics of the North Atlantic variability. He is the author of several books and many articles published in peer-reviewed journals. Sergey teaches at graduate and postgraduate levels at MSU and at the Universities of Kiel and Grenoble.

Sergey is strongly affiliated with WCRP. In 1996-2001 he co-chaired the WCRP Working Group on Air-Sea Fluxes. In 2000-2008 Sergey served as a member of the JSC for WCRP and was a JSC officer in 2004-2008. Currently he is a member of CLIVAR SSG. He organized a number of WCRP workshops and conferences and founded the FLUXNEWS Newsletter. Sergey is also an active contributor to the work of IPCC, both the Nobel Peace Prize winning team's one of 2007 and the new one, to be published in 2013.
